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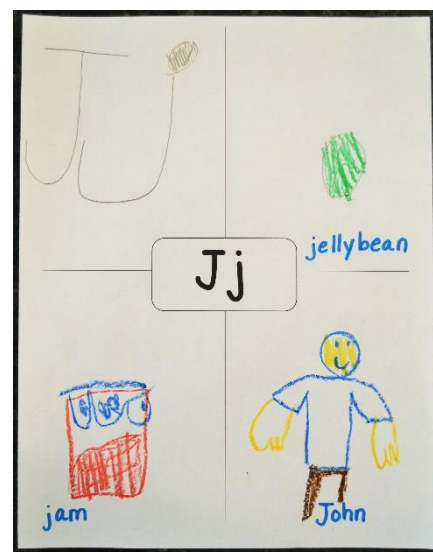


## Alphabet Four Squares Graphic Organizer

This is a simple but effective way to teach your child capital and lowercase letters, the sounds of each letter, writing skills, and is valuable for building vocabulary. The letter is written in the center of the page. In the top left-hand square, I instruct my child to write the capital and lowercase letter. In the other three squares, we work together to come up with three things or words that start with the letter. In the example, my child was asked, "What can you think of that starts with the J sound?" I then made the J sound. My child came up with the words, jellybean, jam, and John. I wrote one word at a time in a square while he drew pictures of the words. You can also choose to have them write the words themselves. Happy learning!

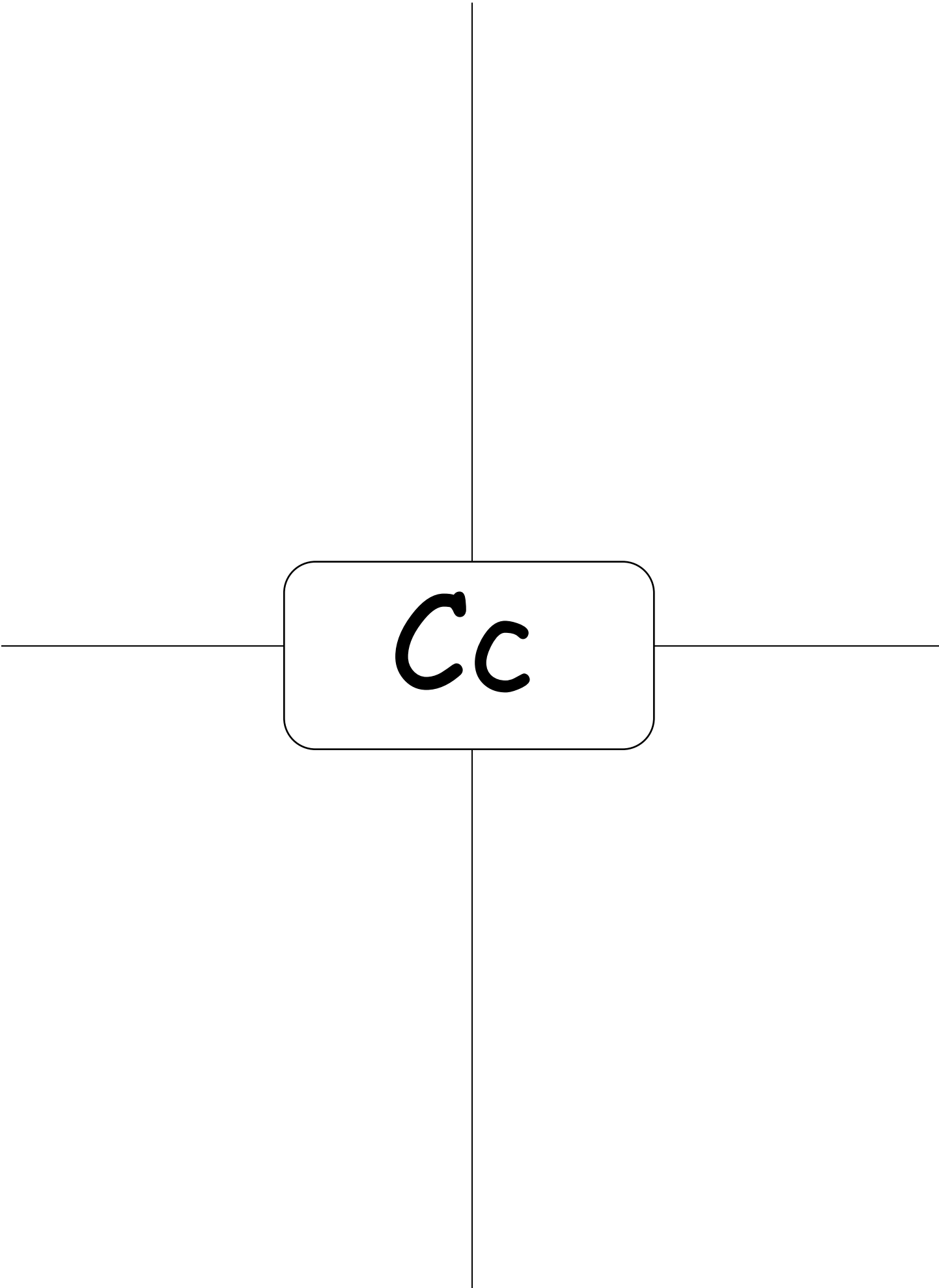
