Police officers use a badge, handcuffs, a baton, and a police car to do their job.




Dentists work at a dental office.



Dentists use a dental chair and dental tools to do their job.




Mail carriers work at the post office.



Mail carriers drive a mail truck. They use stamps, envelopes, and a mail bag to do their job.








Firefighters work at a fire station.



Firefighters drive a fire engine. They use a hose, ax, and fire extinguisher to do their job.




Construction workers work on construction sites.

Paramedics use gloves, a gurney, and a first aid kit to do their job.






A chef works in a restaurant or bakery.
