Crunch Munch Bar & Line Graph

What a fun way to teach your child how to create a bar graph! This method makes introducing graphs easy. For our coop, a snack bag was made for each child using the same number of snack items in each bag. For example, 4 gummy bears, 2 mini marshmallows, 5 pretzels, etc. For a group, this activity may be a little more time consuming. However, if you are working solely with your own children it will not be such an ordeal. Let your child sort the different snacks. Next, the students will count each type of snack. Then the student will color the boxes completely to show how many of each snack there is. To make a greater impact, have your child color each type of snack a different color. For example, if there are 3 pretzels, then your child would color three squares fully in (let's say) blue. Have fun with it! Happy Learning!
