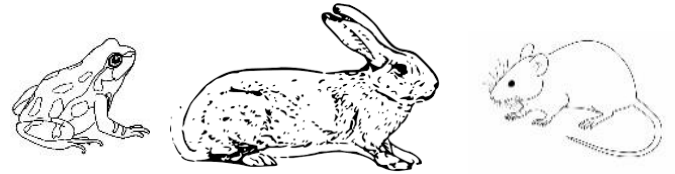
Bird Beaks Matching Cards

You will find 8 different types of bird beak descriptions featured. There is an example bird shown to represent each type of beak shape. There are lots of different shaped beaks, but these are the most common and well-known. Print the matching cards out on preferably on card stock. Cut the cards out and then laminate them for durability. You can give your child all of the cards at once and ask them to pair the beak with the type of food they think is most appropriate for each beak shape or you can simply lay out the beak picture examples and then one at a time, give your student the description of how the bird uses its beak to eat. 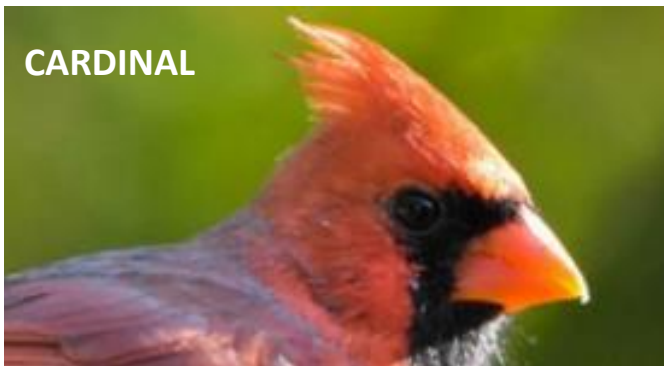
Sharp, curved and pointed

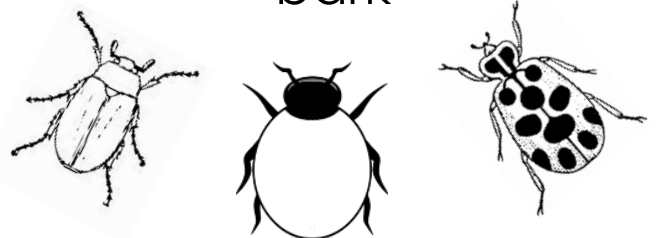
Sipping nectar in flowers

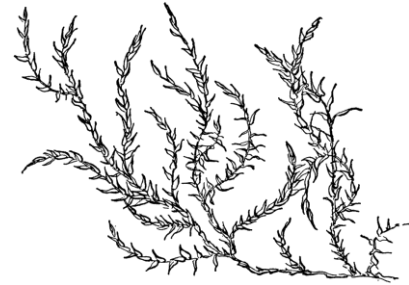
Drilling for insects under tree

Long and flattened



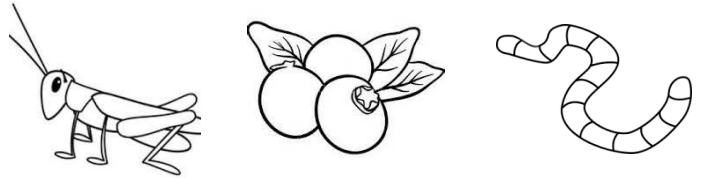
Straining algae and plants



Pointed and thin



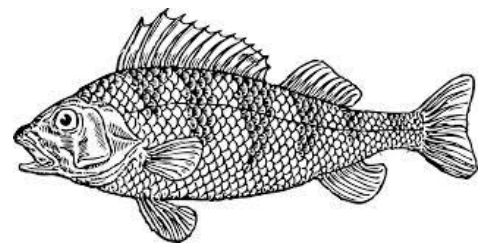
Probing for insects, worms, berries, caterpillars, and grasshoppers
